

WorksWonders

Program Overview

The State's Purchasing from People with Disabilities WorksWonders Program was modified in the 2015 legislative session by the transfer of the administrative and oversight duties for the WorksWonders Program to the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC). The program's enabling statute is found in Chapter 122, Texas Human Resources Code.

As originally enacted by the Texas Legislature in 1978, WorksWonders legislation mandated a State Use Program to promote vocational rehabilitation through special work contracts for visually impaired Texans. During its first year of operation the program was able to secure employment for 22 individuals with disabilities, through the WorksWonders Program, producing products for sale to state agencies.

In 1981 the program's scope successfully extended with legislation to include all individuals with disabilities, not just those individuals with a visual impairment. The following year, the program saw the implementation of its first service contracts, which constitute the majority of today's total contracts. For several decades the program saw increased growth in the number of Texans employed through the WorksWonders Program and the amount of wages paid to those individuals.

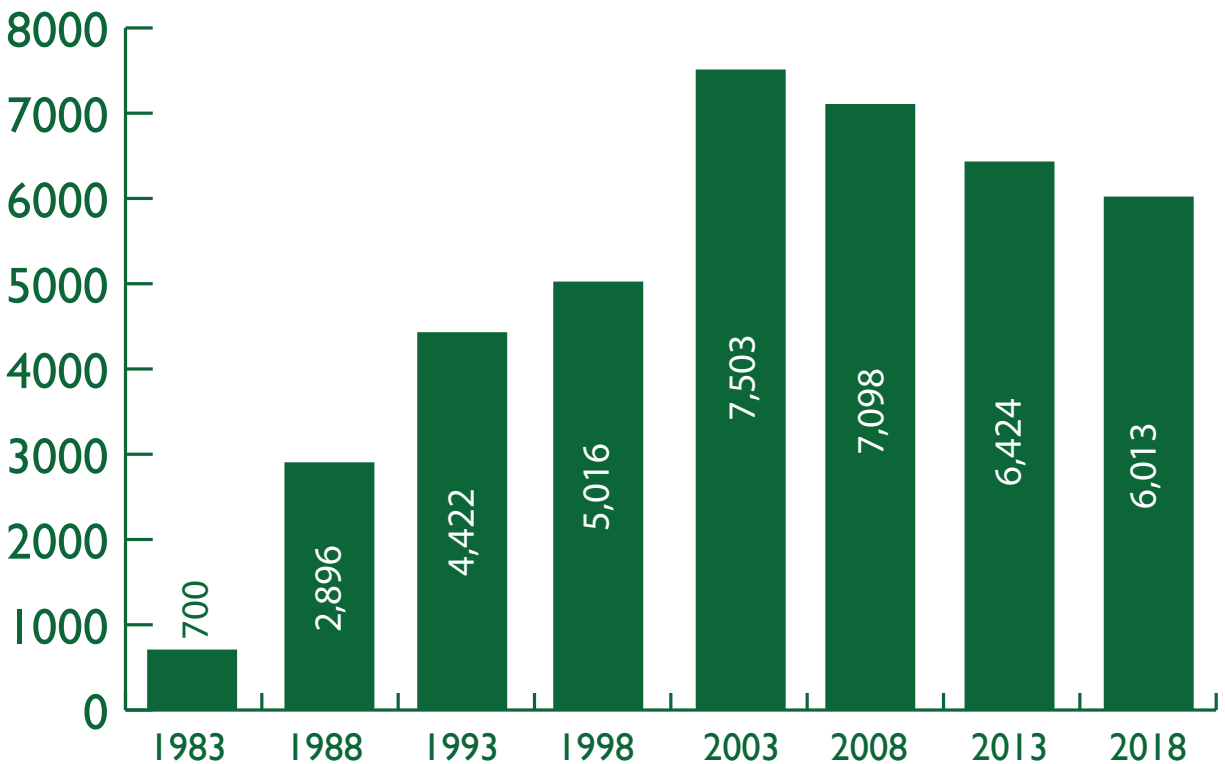
In 2018, more than 6,000 Texans with disabilities were employed in 107 local nonprofit community rehabilitation programs (CRPs) that participate in the WorksWonders Program. These individuals, whose disabilities include mental health condition (1365), intellectual disability (1192), physical impairment (748), visual impairment (618), learning disability (512), chemical disorder (643), hearing impairment (169), brain injury (63) and varying other disabilities (703), earned a combined total of more than \$44 million in wages in 2018.

The WorksWonders Program provides direct benefits to these individuals by offering stable, vocational rehabilitation in their own communities. This training results in meaningful employment and fair wages which promotes self-sufficiency for employees of the program.

In its capacity as the program's administrator, TWC performs: 1.) pricing review and approval of new products and services, with assistance from the Office of the Comptroller of Public Accounts for aspects relating to pricing; 2.) the certification and recertification of CRPs; 3.) review the program rules with input from the newly established advisory committee; 4.) oversight of the Central Nonprofit Agency (CNA), TIBH Industries, Inc. and 5.) support of the 13-member advisory committee established by Senate Bill 212, 84th Legislative Session and made up of members from CRPs, organizations that advocate for people with disabilities, individuals with disabilities and the executive commissioner of the Texas Health and Human Services Commission.

Texans Employed Through WorksWonders State Use Program



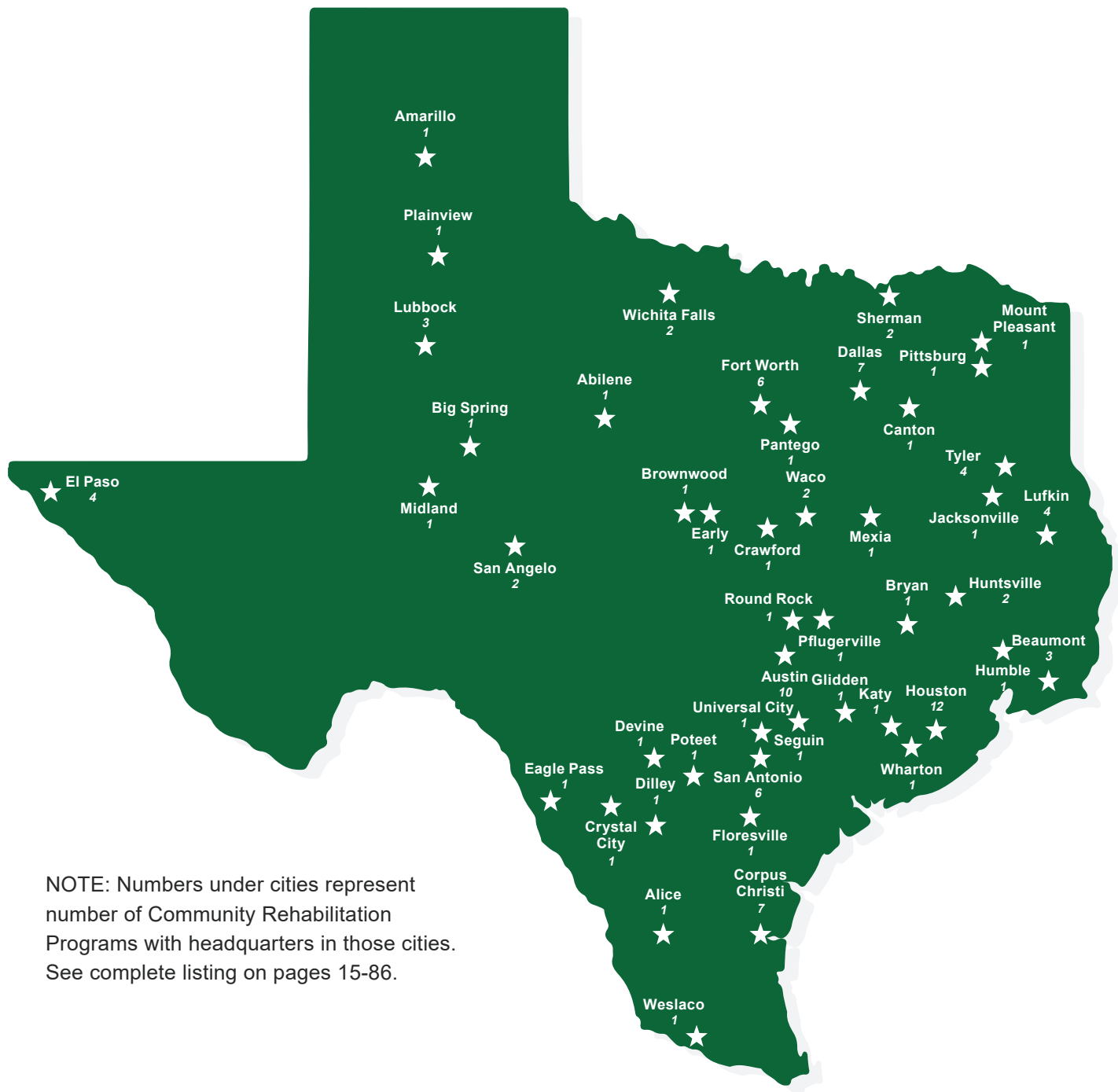
Senate Bill 212 affirmed the previous legislative requirements for the program: 1.) products and services approved for sale through the program remain mandatory for purchase by state agencies, with no formal bidding process; 2.) exception reports continue to be required for submission by state agencies in situations where they forego the purchase of products and services offered by the program; 3.) cities, counties, ISDs, and special district agencies may purchase products and services sold through the program; 4.) the Workforce Commission may contract with an entity to serve as the Central Nonprofit Agency (CNA) to manage ongoing marketing, customer relations, training and contract administration for the program; 5.) the WorksWonders Program was reauthorized under TWC until September 2021, when a new Sunset Advisory Commission review of the program will occur.

Program Impact

FINDING MEANINGFUL EMPLOYMENT opportunities for individuals with disabilities and providing those individuals with the skills necessary to ensure that they can perform effectively in competitive and integrated work environments is a goal of the WorksWonders Program.

Of the 107 community rehabilitation programs (CRPs) that currently participate in the WorksWonders Program, 95 offer vocational rehabilitation and outplacement services to their employees in an attempt to secure competitive employment that meets their strengths and capabilities. These services include but are not limited to: adaptive visual equipment training, chemical/alcohol dependency counseling, educational training, financial planning, high school equivalency prep courses, interview

coaching, job coaching, job placement services, job skills training, and supported employment services.

Placing individuals with disabilities in jobs they want as a career and are ideally suited for, through vocational rehabilitation and outplacement services, has resulted in better retention, higher productivity, more consistency, and higher overall team satisfaction. These individuals are great hires, because they thrive on routine and standardization.

Due to the influence of these services and the positive effect they have on the employees who use them, 1,406 individuals with disabilities were placed in either competitive integrated employment or non-direct labor positions within their CRP.

Glenn Bryant

Living Independently While Working Responsibly

As an employee of Goodwill of East Texas, Glenn Bryant has been developing professional skills and learning to live independently.

Bryant works on the document destruction contract that Goodwill of East Texas holds through TIBH Industries, Inc., and is responsible for keeping track of everything that needs to be shredded at the facility – something in which he takes a lot of pride.

“I like shredding the paper,” Bryant said. “There is a lot of responsibility that goes into that. You have to wear all of your safety equipment, and you have to have your safety glasses.”

As a WorksWonders CRP, Goodwill of East Texas has provided professional and personal support to countless individuals with disabilities, while teaching them how to live independently.

“Part of our program includes classroom instructions on daily living skills and money management, so that when our participants get their paycheck, they have a budget. We teach them how to live outside of Goodwill, as well as inside of Goodwill,” Kimberley Lewis, president and CEO of Goodwill of East Texas, said.

In addition to the instruction that Bryant receives from Goodwill of East Texas, he also receives residential support services through a partnership between Goodwill and Community Access of East Texas, a local-area home service provider, to further develop his independent living skills. He rides the city bus to and from



work, and his bicycle to many places around town, so only occasionally, he needs to be driven somewhere. Community Access assists with that, too.

“I help him [Glenn] with transportation to and from everywhere he needs to go so that he can maintain his independence,” Tonya Hatley, vocational rehabilitation counselor

from Community Access of East Texas, said. “(I drive him) to his doctor’s appointments, to wash his clothes, and to buy his food.”

Goodwill of East Texas helps individuals with disabilities grow in their independence to transition out into the community.

For example, Bryant lives by himself, buys his groceries and washes his own laundry, according to Todd Potoczak, contract sales representative for Goodwill of East Texas. “I think he is an inspiration to Goodwill employees to show them that it can be done, that you don’t have to settle,” Potoczak said.

Bryant’s philosophy in life and at work is to give his all—and it does not go unnoticed.

“He shows other employees that you can go out and work to get the things that you want, not just the things that you need,” Potoczak said.

Transitioning to Integrated Employment

Curtis Johnson of Lubbock had been employed on the road crew for the Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) contract at Star Care Specialty Health System (Star Care) – a WorksWonders Program CRP – for five years when he received an opportunity to expand his employment horizons.

“Bruce Thornton Air Conditioning (BTAC) was referred to us because they wanted to employ someone within our program,” Nona Scott, employment coordinator at Star Care, said. “We immediately thought of Curtis because he was constantly volunteering, giving directives to his coworkers, and taking on leadership roles within the program.”

Using the job training skills he learned at Star Care, Johnson interviewed with BTAC and was offered a position on their team. He now keeps the warehouse cleaned and organized, stocks inventory in the warehouse, and helps load the trucks before they go out for/on jobs.

“In developing our vocational programs, our main goal is to be able to allow all of our employees to establish skills that will enable them to transfer into integrated employment,” Cheryl Baker, director of Intellectual Disability Services at Star Care, said.

In addition to the vocational training that Star Care employees receive, Baker emphasizes the value of the work that employees are able to

perform on the different types of contracts offered through the Program.

“The skills that an employee can learn from working on any one of our contracts, from

our clock contract, to our road and janitorial crews, are all transferable to mainstream employment,” Baker said.

Although Johnson has been employed with BTAC for nearly one year, he still frequently visits Star Care and maintains the

relationships and close knit community he gained while working there.

“When Curtis walks back into the center with his new employer’s shirt on, everyone wants to know about that and what he is doing at his job,” Baker said. “He is definitely a leader.”

Johnson enjoys being a role model to his former peers.

“It makes me feel that I can give back to them,” Johnson said. “If they see me out there working, they can learn from me and go out and try to get a new job of their own.”

Wages and Hours

for Employees with Disabilities

A few Texas CRPs participating in the WorksWonders Program utilize a special wages certificate issued by the U.S. Department of Labor under Section 14(c) of the Fair Labor Standards Act (29 U.S.C. 214(c)) to pay certain workers with significant disabilities at a rate below the federal minimum wage. The allowable “commensurate” wage rate involves documentation and calculations of a worker’s abilities and productivity and permits the CRP-employer to pay a lower hourly wage rate approved by the Department of Labor. The process is subject to regular auditing and oversight and permits certain CRPs to offer employment to individuals who may otherwise be unemployed. These day jobs often permit the worker’s parent or guardian to secure their own employment to support the family.

Balancing Workforce and Systems to Improve Wages

Since its opening in 1983, Tex Spice has served adults with disabilities in the Medina Valley area by providing employment opportunities in its spice packaging facility, as well as offering day habilitation, allowing participants to work with a service coordinator to identify goals and objectives that translate to both work and their personal lives. This ensures that whether they're working on the packaging line or attending day habilitation, employees are learning valuable life skills.

Tex Spice began working with the WorksWonders program in 1985 with six employees. Today, it employs 28 individuals with disabilities who work on loading, weighing, bottling, sealing, labeling and boxing nearly 20 different spices, with the assistance of a machine for part of the process. The organization also has a contract for headphones, although spice packaging is its primary service.



Located in Devine, Tex Spice allows employees to work five hours a day, from one day a week to five days a week, and they also have the opportunity to attend the day habilitation program when they're not working on the packaging line. In December of 2016, Tex Spice purchased a machine that automated part of the packaging process, reducing the number of employees needed on the line at one time from 25 to 13. This reduction in the workforce

was coupled with an increase in pay from below minimum wage to minimum wage for all employees. As such, Tex Spice staff had to find a way to continue distributing work among its 28 employees in order to keep them in the workforce.

Marcie Andrews, general manager at Tex Spice, says that while it was tricky balancing

the dramatically increased labor cost with the reduced labor hours, they employed a system to help keep everyone employed.

Tex Spice's day habilitation services also help maintain balance. Employees who are not working on the packaging line are able to attend workshops and classes where they learn important life skills and engage with one another in a social setting.

The group often takes day trips and volunteers in the community—while working toward goals and objectives designed to enhance their work and personal lives.

The addition of the machine to the packaging process also helps

Tex Spice fulfill more spice orders than before. Andrews estimates they can now produce twice as many orders with the help of automation to scoop the spices, although it is not ideal for all spices.

“The Italian spices still have to be scooped by hand,” Andrews said. “When we have our employees manually scoop, we can have more on the line at one time, but we just don't produce as much in the same amount of time.”

Currently, staff is in charge of cleaning the machine between spices due to the complicated nature of all of the pieces. However, Tex Spice plans to begin training a few employees on how to take apart, clean and put the machine back together, which will add another job opportunity for employees who are able.



One thing that hasn't changed despite the increased wages and shuffled work schedules at Tex Spice is the support and accommodations that the organization offers its employees. Currently, there are two vans with daily routes that pick up and take home 22 different employees, both those on the line and those attending day habilitation.

Employees enjoy generous vacation time, and they are able to earn days off even if they are only working one day a week. In the packaging facility, employees are only assigned tasks if they are physically able to do them, and special care is taken to make sure that everyone is

given the time they need to complete a job, with an emphasis on working together.

“We sometimes have to fix problems that aren't always budgeted for,” Andrews said. “We get it done, because this place is too important not to.”

State Use Fund

Overage Usage: Beyond Employment

Uniforms, classes, mental health services benefit participants, their communities

CRPs providing products and services through the WorksWonders program and its State Use contracts are all non-profit or governmental entities whose purpose is to provide employment opportunities for individuals with disabilities. And yet products and services sold through this program not only benefit these individuals with the direct employment opportunities they create, but also fund other programs for their employees and local communities.

Here are a few examples of those additional programs and services:

On Our Own Services in Houston provides services such as janitorial, grounds maintenance and litter pickup statewide. Funds generated by State Use contracts, in addition to funding the costs of the contracts, are used for equipment upgrades, uniforms, raises and administrative staff to meet new compliance requirements and services to promote and maintain quality employees.

As an example, On Our Own staff gives informal driving lessons to assist individuals obtain drivers licenses to aid in career advancement. Staff also assists in outplacement opportunities into competitive integrated employment. Once employment is obtained, On Our Own provides job coaches to better ensure success is achieved in the competitive integrated environment. Another way State Use funds are used is to assist employees in paying rent during the winter months when outdoor services are slow.

East Texas Lighthouse for the Blind in Tyler operates a large client services division, which spent \$1.3M in 2017, including funds collected through State Use contracts, to serve more than 400 people in the community. Their client services program offers orientation and mobility training, Microsoft Office classes, college prep courses, braille lessons and independent living classes. The Lighthouse also runs a low vision store, which offers hundreds of items for people experiencing vision loss. With the assistance of funds collected from State Use contracts, these items are available at low or even no cost based on need.

Andrews Diversified Industries in Tyler is part of a local Mental Health Authority, Andrews Center and provides services, including picnic area maintenance, through the State Use Program. Monies collected from State Use contracts fund a variety of services offered in the five-county area served by Andrews Center. Through these funds, the Center is able to provide comprehensive mental health services, including doctors and nurses, case managers, and therapists, to the community, as well as to individual clients and workers.

TWC Desk Review

Results

This year TWC launched a desk review initiative where CRPs applying for recertification were evaluated for compliance with TWC rules and Texas laws.

CRPs that fail to meet requirements may have their recertification delayed or revoked. Each year, noncompliant CRPs will be revisited and additional CRPs due for recertification will be seen and reviewed.

Next year, a Person-Centered Plan for each employee will be required to record a path toward the individual's work integration and to ensure that individual employment desires and goals are met.

Of the more than 107 CRPs in the WorksWonders program, 19 statewide have been visited, during which TWC staff reviewed a random sample of cases with survey size depending on the number of employees. CRP employee numbers ranged from six to 100. If documentation of any kind was missing, the CRP had 30 days to provide proof.

TWC staff reviewed CRPs for the following:

State Use Program Required

- An alphabetical list of direct labor employees with disabilities.
- An alphabetical list of employees with disabilities performing supervision, inspections and/or quality control and other personnel classified as indirect labor who are employed or working on State Use contracts, or placed in integrated employment.
- An alphabetical list of direct labor employees without disabilities.
- State Use files containing approved Documentation of Disabilities for each employee with disabilities.
- A plan for integrated employment and a Person-Centered Plan for individuals with a disability, effective next fiscal year.
- Direct Labor ratio.
- A copy of changes to each CRP's Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws, if they have changed since the last certification.

* If applicable.

Department of Labor Required

- A list of all hourly paid employees who are paid less than \$7.25 per hour and the corresponding documentation and justification of the wage rate.*
- Copies of the current prevailing wage rates, time studies, and corresponding piece rate sheets for all operations on which any employee is paid special minimum wage.*
- A copy of the agency's current certificate authorizing special minimum wage payment, 14c.*
- Document Health and Welfare Benefits and record indication the payment of Health and Welfare Benefits.
- Two periods of payroll records from the previous quarter.
- Maintain payroll, human resource functions, accounting, and all relevant documentation showing that the employees who produce products or perform services under the state use program are individuals with disabilities, §806.41 (e).
- Copy of current Certificate of Insurance.
