# §804.24. Reporting Requirements.

A public junior college, public technical institute, public state college, charter school, or school district receiving a grant under this chapter must comply with all reporting requirements of the contract in the frequency and format determined by the Agency in order to maintain eligibility for grant payments. Failure to comply with the reporting requirements may result in termination of the grant award and the entity being ineligible for future grants under this chapter.

#### §804.25. Enforcement.

(a) Grant funds must be used in compliance with the terms of the contract for the purposes designated in the contract or will be subject to refund by the grantee, disqualification from receiving further funds under this chapter, or any other available legal remedies. If deemed appropriate, the grantee may also be referred to another department or agency including, but not limited to, the State Auditor's Office and the Agency's Office of Investigations.

Grants for Career and Technical Education Programs. 4 5 (a) This subchapter is applicable to JET awards to public junior colleges, public 6 technical institutes, public state colleges, charter schools, and school districts 7 for the development of career and technical education programs that meet the 8 requirements of Texas Education Code, §134.006 and §134.007. 9 10 11 (b) A grant received under this subchapter may be used only: 12 13 (1) to support courses or programs that prepare students for career employment in occupations that are identified by local businesses as 14 being in high demand; 15 16 (2) to finance the initial costs of career and technical education courses or 17 program development, including the costs of purchasing equipment, 18 and other expenses associated with the development of an appropriate 19 course; and 20 21 22 to finance a career and technical education course or program that leads to a license, certificate, or postsecondary degree. 23 24 (c) In awarding a grant under this subchapter, the Agency shall primarily 25 consider the potential economic returns to the state from the development of 26 the career and technical education course or program. The Agency may also 27 consider whether the course or program: 28 29 30 (1) is part of a new, emerging industry or high-demand occupation; 31 offers new or expanded dual-credit career and technical educational 32 (2) 33 opportunities in public high schools; 34 35 offers new career and technical educational opportunities not previously available to students enrolled at any campus in the 36 37 Windham School District; or 38 39 is provided in cooperation with other public junior colleges, public technical institutes, or public state colleges across existing service 40 41 areas. 42 43 (d) A grant recipient shall provide the matching funds as identified in its application. 44 45
