## Do you have a hard time hearing on the phone? Or hearing your coworkers or boss?

If you have a hearing impairment that affects your ability to prepare for, obtain, maintain or advance in employment, you may be eligible for VR services. Some examples of how VR can help you keep your job or assist you in preparing for or finding and retaining employment may include: hearing aids;

cochlear implants and bone anchored hearing aids (BAHA); assistive technology;

communication access services; employment assistance, and accommodations.

The VR program receives 78.7 percent of its funding through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education. For the 2021 Federal fiscal year, the total amount of grant funds awarded are \$295,273,713. The remaining 21.3 percent (\$79,915,249) are funded by Texas State Appropriations.

For purposes of the Supported Employment program, the VR agency receives 90 percent of its funding through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education. For the 2021 Federal fiscal year, the total amount of grant funds awarded are \$1,471,020. The remaining 10 percent (\$81,723) are funded by Texas State Appropriations. Revised March 2021.
